



As your Space Coast Symphony Orchestra returns to the concert hall, we are doing everything we can to keep our audiences, performers and volunteer staff safe. As you prepare to attend a concert, please know that we've updated our procedures and policies to keep you safe until we return to normalcy.

Here's what you need to know:

- Patrons should arrive no earlier than 45 minutes before the concert start time. Doors open no earlier than 45 minutes prior to performance. We aim to avoid prolonged seating and any forms of congestion.
- We will limit seating capacity to 40%. In addition, we will close / block off every other row of seats.
- Face coverings are required for all attendees, volunteers, and Staff Members. Please bring your own facial covering and wear it to the theatre. Face coverings must fully cover the nose and mouth and be worn at all times throughout the performance.
- Patrons will be required to have their temperature taken with no-touch thermometers before entry.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be located throughout the concert hall.
- Concessions will not be available. Water and small snacks will be available outdoors when you arrive.
- There will be no raffles.
- There will be no printed programs for the concerts. Information on the concert will be displayed on the screen prior to the concert start.
- To minimize congregation, patrons are encouraged to locate the restroom nearest to their seat at any time throughout the performance.
- There will not be a full intermission. Rather, we will have a 5 minute stretch in the middle of the program.
- Musicians will not be greeting audiences following performances.
- All surfaces and seats will be sprayed with industrial antiviral/antibacterial solution prior to all performances.
- Symphony for Everyone will be available based on amount of seats left for each performance. Purchased tickets and pass holders will be first priority.

By attending an SCSO performance, you are confirming that you and all persons in your party are not experiencing any of the following symptoms of COVID-19 identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention at [CDC.gov](https://www.cdc.gov), including: Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, and Nausea or vomiting. Parties are also confirming that all members have not been in contact with someone with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 symptoms without completing a 14 day quarantine or are not under any self-quarantine orders.

Our main goal is to protect you, our musicians, and volunteers. We feel these measures will keep you at ease. Thank you for your help in keeping us all safe and for supporting your Symphony Orchestra.
