





One thousand patrons were treated to an invigorating performance from Tulsa vocalist, trumpeter and band leader, Jeff Shadley. Music came from the libraries of George and Ira Gershwin, Cole Porter, Harold Arlen, Johnny Mercer, Jimmy Van Heusen, Dean Martin, and Frank Sinatra. This was Shadley's second appearance with the SCSO.



Sea Pictures was an exciting return to the classics! Our first full masterworks program since the pandemic opened with Hebrides Overture, Mezzo soprano, Eliza Dopira joined the orchestra to sing Elgar's evocative song cycle, Sea Pictures. Central Florida standout, Kristin Naigus performed Sibelius' haunting work, The Swan of Tuonela. The concert was rounded out with Sibelius' epic tone poem, Finlandia and selections from Tchaikovsky's beautiful Swan Lake.

In March, the music from your favorite films were brought to life in two epic concerts featuring classics from Academy Award-winning composer John Williams. The SCSO presented favorites including Superman, Jurassic Park, and Star Wars. In addition, we featured several of our incredible musicians on some of Williams' more intimate works, including Jean Black on Angela's Ashes, Carey Moorman on Schindler's List, Cindy Scaruffi-Klispie on Lincoln, and Paul Fleury on Memoirs of a Geisha.





"Yesterday afternoon was our first live concert since the pandemic and it was well worth the three hour round trip to Vero Beach - through no less than four torrential downpours. The Space Coast Symphony Orchestra under Aaron Collins was in fine form. The large auditorium was as 'packed to overflowing' as social distancing allowed, the audience exuberant at finally being able to experience live music in a concert hall!

Collins built the programme around two piano works and celebrated soloist Jeffrey Biegel. It opened with the Kenneth Fuchs concerto 'The Spiritualist'. This sparkling work drew the audience in and it is a testament to its sound structure and level of invention that it kept their attention throughout. Biegel's flawless pianism was not surprising: he was soloist in Fuchs's 2020 Grammy award winning CD named for this concerto. Biegel followed this with an eloquent solo work he composed in memory of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg.

After interval, a rousing rendition of Ravel's Bolero preceded Biegel's return for a most expressive 'Rhapsody in Blue' in its original orchestration. As with the previous concerto, balance between soloist and orchestra was well judged, this fine performance earning a prolonged standing ovation."
