Summer wouldn't have the same sizzle without a patriotic concert by your Space Coast Symphony Wind Orchestra and Chorus. This red, white and blue concert will honor all those who have worn our nation's uniform. This all-American program will showcase our national heritage, as conductor Aaron T. Collins directs the wind orchestra with music by Richard Rodgers, Mark Piszczek, Eric Whitacre, Lee Greenwood, and marches from "The March King," John Philip Sousa. The concert features Eric Whitacre's thrilling *Ghost Train*. In this highly programmatic work, Eric transforms a story from American folklore of a supernatural locomotive that roars throughout the Western U.S. Rich in special effects and unique compositional techniques, this dynamic piece creates vivid aural images as the train leaves the station and passes through a varied landscape. Rounding out the program is Adam Gorb's *Yiddish Dances*. Gorb's brilliant classic combines his passion for wind orchestra and klezmer (the folk music of Yiddish-speaking people) with his theatrical flair in five traditionally based dances. Thrilling, touching, affectionate, endlessly inventive, vividly scored, and vibrant, this exciting work will keep you on the edge of your seat.

This enchanting program explores the kaleidoscopic colors of Scandinavian music. The concert opens up with Hans Christian Lumbye's Copenhagen Steam Railway Galop which faithfully recreates the sounds of a train chugging out of a station and grinding to a halt at the next stop. The work was composed in 1847 to celebrate the opening of the first railway in Denmark between Copenhagen and Roskilde. Continuing the trip you'll hear Carl Nielsen's wonderfully ebullient Maskarade Overture, exploding with Nielsen's characteristic melodies taking unexpected twists and turns at every opportunity, It was 1902 when Finnish composer Jean Sibelius finished his Symphony No. 2 – right at a time when his country was struggling with Russian oppression through extreme sanctions on the Finnish language and culture. While Finland fought for its independence as best it could, Sibelius' composition became the unofficial light at the end of the tunnel – the voice of Finnish nationalism – and gave a renewed hope to the Finnish people, a perfect example of beauty created in the midst of chaos. Rounding out the concert, SCSO Trombonist, Thomas McKee will perform Launy Grøndahl's popular and energetic Trombone Concerto, a lyrical and dramatic work

Your Space Coast Symphony Orchestra teams with Central Florida Vocal Arts and Opera del Sol to present *The Sound of Music in Concert*. Featuring a trove of cherished songs from the final collaboration between Rodgers & Hammerstein including "Climb Ev'ry Mountain," "My Favorite Things," "Do Re Mi," "Sixteen Going on Seventeen" and the title number, The Sound of Music won the hearts of audiences worldwide, earning five Tony Awards and five Oscars. The inspirational story, based on the memoir of Maria Augusta Trapp, follows an ebullient postulate who serves as governess to the seven children of the imperious Captain von Trapp, bringing music and joy to the household. But as the forces of Nazism take hold of Austria, Maria and the entire von Trapp family must make a moral decision. Featuring an incredible cast, don't miss this incredible concert production with the gorgeous sound of a full orchestra of the world's most beloved musical.

In honor of the anniversary of September 11, your Space Coast Symphony will pay tribute to the victims and survivors, their families, and emergency responders, whose lives were forever impacted on that tragic day. Opening the program is Samuel Barber's moving and searing *Adagio for Strings* in it's original form for string quartet. Considered by many to be the most popular of all 20th-century orchestral works, *Adagio for Strings* is celebrated for its fragile simplicity and emotion. The destruction of the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001 had a deeply personal resonance for composer Kenneth Fuchs, who had lived in New York City for 20 years. His *Falling Man* was inspired by the 2007 novel about life after 9/11 by Don DeLillo, and is a series of arias and interludes written for voice and orchestra. It will feature celebrated baritone, Thomas Potter. The concert will close with Aaron's personal favorite work, Samuel Barber's powerful *Symphony No. 1*, a compelling work with unbridled energy and heart-on-sleeve passion. Rounding out this moving program are works by Aaron Copland and John Williams.



Frank Wosar leads the Space Coast Symphony Jazz Orchestra in an incredible tribute to two of the most important figures in jazz, Stan Kenton and Maynard Ferguson. Kenton was known for his big blaring horn sections—his was the original "wall of sound" long before Phil Spector developed a similar concept in pop and rock. The concert will feature an enlarged big band (the same size as Kenton's) playing a number of songs written and arranged by Kenton, including *Malaguena, Peanut Vendor*; and *A Little Minor Booze*. The concert will also pay homage to trumpeter and composer, Maynard Ferguson. Ferguson came to prominence playing in Stan Kenton's orchestra before forming his own band in 1957. Selections from Ferguson will include *Coconut Champagne, Don't Let the Sun Go Down on Me, Birdland, MacArthur Park*, and many more!

Celebrate Thanksgiving with your Space Coast Symphony Orchestra! Grammy-winning pianist, Jeffrey Biegel returns to Central Florida to perform three incredible works, including the world premiere of Christopher Marshall's *Thanksgiving Variations*, a set of stunning, virtuosic variations based on the popular hymn, "We Gather Together." Biegel will also perform a moving work he wrote, a themed trilogy titled *Three Reflections*, which includes a "Reflection of Justice: An Ode to Ruth Bader Ginsburg", "Reflection of Freedom: An Ode to John Fitzgerald Kennedy" and, "Reflection of Equality: An Ode to Martin Luther King." Also on the program is Dick Tunney's enchanting *Peanuts Concerto*, based on the music of Charlie Brown composer, Vince Guaraldi. This moving arrangement sets Guaraldi's classic music from the Peanuts specials, into a three-movement work for piano and orchestra. It will be a wonderful introduction for families to hear the jazz writings of the late Guaraldi in a 21st century symphonic landscape. The program is rounded out with two works from Aaron Copland, "The Promise of Living" from *The Tender Land* and "Simple Gifts" from *Appalachian Spring*. The Shaker tune "Simple Gifts" was written in 1848 by Joseph Brackett and made famous by Copland. This well-loved tune has come to symbolize simplicity, joy and freedom.

Wise pianists fear Rachmaninoff's Third Piano Concerto, one of the most fiendishly difficult pieces ever composed for piano, but also one of his most loved for its gorgeous lyricism. Monumental doesn't even begin to describe it. Prepare for an extraordinary concert experience when celebrated and award-winning pianist Lindsay Garritson takes on the staggering virtuosity of "Rach 3," a piece so demanding it's often described as the Mt. Everest of concertos. Brahms's *Fourth Symphony* is a titan of the symphonic repertoire. In his final symphony, the composer weaves a musical narrative evoking both dramatic intensity and profound serenity delivering a concert finale of heightened emotion. Filled with deep emotion, profound complexity and beautiful melancholy, Brahms' *Fourth Symphony* finishes with a finale that will leave you speechless.
